

Bakersfield College Department of Public Safety Parking Rules and Regulations
Please refer to the Bakersfield College parking lot map for the location.

Traffic and parking regulations shall be enforced at all times.

Park according to posted parking signs and these instructions only. Violators may receive citations. Parking permits are not valid unless displayed in the proper manner on your vehicle during the time the vehicle is parked on campus.

Semester permits: You can obtain your student semester permit at: www.thepermitstore.com. The permit must be attached to the inside of the lower left (drivers) side of the vehicles windshield.

Towing: Multiple parking violations which are unpaid may result in the "TOWING" of the vehicle. If this occurs, before the vehicle will be released all outstanding violation must be paid, the towing costs, storage cost will also have to be paid and the vehicle must be released to the vehicle owner. Authority State of California. Vehicle Code Section 22651(i) (1).

Designated parking zones on campus are: Please refer to the Bakersfield College parking lot map for the location.

Student Parking: Student parking is available in three major parking areas on the main campus; Student lots on the main campus are located on the SE, SW, and NE corners. Permits are not valid unless displayed in/on lower drivers side front windshield, visible for inspection of number and date of issue, from outside the vehicle.

Free parking: The free parking area is at the corner of University and Mt. Vernon. It is directly behind the Baseball field area. This area ends with a white line painted on the asphalt surface near the recycle area. [Please refer to the Bakersfield College parking lot map for the location.](#)

Permit Dispensers: Daily parking permit dispensers have been installed in every BC campus student parking lot. The daily parking fee is \$1. Daily permits are available in all student parking lots, and may be obtained by inserting coins or dollars into parking permit dispenser. Student daily permits are valid only in the student lots and may be used in any student parking lot on date of purchase. Guest/Visitor Parking: Guest, temporary or other special parking permits may be requested at the Department of Public Safety, Levinson Hall (West Wing). Guest/visitor permits shall be placed in plain view on the driver's front side of the dash, filled out according to instructions on the permit.

Staff Parking: Staff permits are required for parking in all staff parking lots. A current Staff parking permit shall be displayed at all times in/on all vehicles parked in posted "Staff Parking Permits Required" parking lots on the Main Campus, Delano Center and Weill Institute. Limited time parking: Forty-five minute visitor parking is available for visitors and guests only. Therefore, Bakersfield College staff and students shall not park in the posted 45-minute visitor parking only areas. Note: There is no student parking available from the Haley Street entrance to the campus.

Handicapped Parking: Handicapped students may obtain a handicapped-parking permit which is valid only in the BC campus handicapped zones. Temporarily handicapped students may obtain a temporary permit with a written authorization from a physician from the Department of Public Safety, in Levinson Hall (West Wing).

- No motor vehicle, moped or motor-driven cycle shall be driven, parked, or left standing on any campus walkway or any interior service roadway or lawn without a special permit issued by the Department of Public Safety.

- Vehicles illegally parked on the college campus shall be issued citations under sections of the California Vehicle Code.
- No motor vehicle, motorcycle, moped or motor-driven cycle shall be parked or left standing in front of any gate, driveway, fire lane, or next to a red curb.
- Motorcycles, mopeds or any motor-driven cycle shall be parked in posted "Motorcycle Parking-Permit Required" zones. (Bicycle racks are for bicycle parking only.)
- The maximum speed limit on campus is 15 miles per hour.
- No vehicle is to be parked within 50 feet of any entrance or exit to a campus building in accordance with fire regulations. It is our hope that by making you aware of campus parking regulations, you will avoid receiving a parking violation citation. Should you receive a parking violation citation on Campus, please refer to the California Vehicle Code.
- Vehicles shall be parked in such a manner as not to block the path or progress of any vehicle or pedestrian.
- No vehicle shall be parked in a manner taking more than one parking space.
- All vehicles shall be parked with the front of the vehicle toward the front or top of the parking space.
- No driver or person shall throw, or allow to be thrown, any substances from a stopped or moving vehicle while upon or within the campus area.

Authority

State of California. Vehicle Code. Notice of Parking Violation. 40202. (c) Once the issuing officer has prepared the notice of parking violation and has attached it to the vehicle as provided in subdivision (a), the officer shall file notice with the processing agency. Any person, including the issuing officer and any member of the officer's department or agency, or any peace officer who alters, conceals, modifies, or destroys, or causes to be altered, concealed, modified, nullified, or destroys the face of the remaining original or any copy of a citation that was retained by the officer, for any reason, before it is filed with the processing agency or with a person authorized to receive the deposit of the parking penalty, is guilty of a misdemeanor. If, after a copy of the notice of parking violation is attached to the vehicle, the issuing officer determines that, in the interest of justice, the notice of parking violation should be dismissed, the issuing agency may recommend, in writing, that the charges be dismissed. The recommendation shall cite the reason for the recommendation and shall be filed with the processing agency. If the processing agency makes a finding that there are grounds for dismissal, the finding shall be entered on the record and the notice of parking violation shall be canceled pursuant to paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) or Section 40215. "Under no circumstances shall a personal relationship with any officer, public official, or law enforcement agency be grounds for dismissal."
